

Bio's of our visiting Instructors-January 9th, 2011 Cross Training Workshop



Sensei Carter has been studying martial arts for over 44 years. He currently holds ranks of Rukudan in Kodokan Judo, Godan in Kodenkan Danzan Ryu Jujitsu and Shodan in Tae Kwon-Do. He is a life member of the Pacific Coast Kilohana Association, Jujitsu America and U.S. Judo Association. He is also a member of The Professional Martial Arts Alliance and the United States Sports Jujitsu Association, and on the team medical staff. He is a certified massage therapist for the last 57 years and holds two Instructors Certifications in Shiatsu Meridian Therapy and Japanese Restoration Therapy. He also has certification in GiGong Massage Therapy and Seifukujitsu Restoration Therapy.

Awards: Ohana Award 1990, United States Martial Arts Founders Award 2001, Martial Arts Hall of Fame Award 2001, Legend Award 2002, Associate Professorship 2004, Master of Massage Award 2006, Lifetime Achievement Award 2006.

He was is on the Jujitsu America and Pacific Coast Kilohana, Sports Medicine and Massage Committees and was the Examiner and Trainer on Remedial Acupressure for the Kwang Dur Kwan, Tae Kwon Do in 1990 and 1991. He has conducted Shiatsu Massage, GiGong Massage Therapy and Seifukujitsu Restoration Therapy Massage Therapy and Seifukujitsu Restoration Therapy workshops and seminars throughout the United States, Canada, England, Germany, Ireland, Mexico, Spain and New Zealand.



A Hawaiian native, **Kyoshi Coelho** began his martial arts training in Hawaii in 1957. His first instructor was Professor Libert O'Sullivan at Moiliili dojo on the island of Oahu.

Kyoshi moved to the mainland in 1960 and began his training under Professor Sig Kufferath at the Los Altos Aiki Jitsu dojo, in Los Altos California. In 1965, Nikko Jujitsu & Mountain View Aiki Kai was established by Professor Kufferath, Senseis Fermin Urmeneta, Robert Nadeau and Coelho.

Kyoshi holds the rank of rokodan in dan zan ryu and rank in aikido and judo. He is a founding member of Kilohana Martial Arts Association, and past president of Kilohana. In addition, Kyoshi is a representative of dan zan ryu jujitsu with the World Head of Family Sokeship Council. WHFSC is headed by Grandmaster Frank Sanchez, who is a 1960's Nikko dojo mate of Kyoshi. He is also a member of the executive board of the Hawaii Marital Arts Society, led by Professor Jaime Abregana. Currently, Kyoshi Coelho is an instructor with the Los Angeles police department in their Jeopardy Kids program in West Los Angeles. This program is headed by Sensei Mark Wald and his hui hale mana.



Grandmaster Arthur Gonzalez is Head Master and Leader of the Promotion of Tenio's DeCuerdas Escrima Concepts, a complete American-Filipino Art.

The schools curriculum consists of: But, not limited to Weapon-to-Weapon Skills. Specializing in knife-to-knife play and knife grappling skills. Tenio was famous for his hand-to-hand combat and hand-to-weapon combat concepts. From this he forged a Great Self-Defence Mugging situation format.

One of his greatest assets was his belief in constant evolution of his art, to fit with the modern world. Which gave us: The Arresting and Securing Program that teaches team work, The Police Baston Arresting Program, The Gun Disarm and Gun retention course, The Womens Rape and Awareness Program, The Cadena de Mano, which links are Major Key Words together. 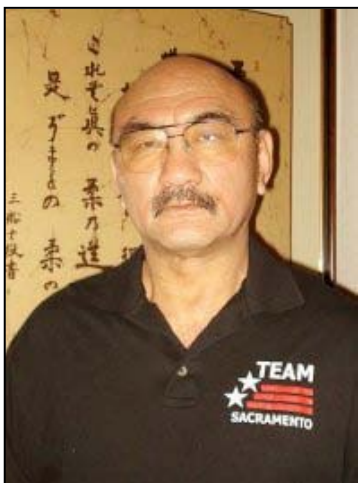


Professor Rowdy Hall & Professor Margarita Jimenez are the Chief Instructors of Seikishin Dojo, located in Morgan Hill, California. Professor Hall has been a student of the Martial Arts since 1964. On November 13th, 2010, he was recently awarded the title of Professor, by the Kilohana Martial Arts Association. On July 30th, 2005 Professor Hall was inducted into the United States Martial Arts Hall of Fame. On January 1st, 2000, Professor Hall along with Professor Margarita Jimenez, Co-Found Koshiden - Ryu Jujutsu,

Professor Hall holds ranks in American Kenpo, Kodokai Daito-Ryu Aikijujutsu, Hakko-Ryu Jujutsu, Seibukan Jujutsu, Aikido, Shinkendo & Toyama -Ryu Batto-Jutsu. He has also trained in a variety of martial art systems including, Judo, Enshin-Itto-Ryu Iaido, Kokodo Kyu Shin Ryu Jujutsu, Chinese Bok-Fu, Boxing & Inayan Eskrima.

Professor Hall is heavily involved in the healing art. He owns and operates Restoration Massage Therapy Center in Morgan Hill, Ca where he has two offices. He is the Director of Academics for the School of Kilohana Massage & Healing Arts, where Professor Okazaki method of Restoration Massage is taught.

He holds Certificates in both the Basic & Advance levels of Seifukujitsu as taught by Professor Muro. Acupressure Points (Koho Shiatsu) as taught by Shodai Soke Yasuhiro Irie. He is a Graduate of the National Academy of Sports Medicine (Performance Enhancement & Corrective Exercise Specialist). De Anza College Sports Massage program, taught by Dr. Justin Brink, Certified Kineso Taping Practioner, and completed the Level 1 course in Selective Muscle Function Assessment. Professor Hall continues his education in Therapeutic & Rehabilitation Massage. Professor Hall is a Retired Police Officer. He is a graduate of the FBI Swat School, San Jose Police Merge Handgun School, Gun sight advance certification courses in pistol, carbine rifle, and Shotgun. He has experience in undercover narcotics, narcotic enforcement, high risk entries, and dignitary protection. He is a Tactical Defensive Instructor both in armed and unarmed defense. He has his advance instructor certification in the Koga method, FBI tactical defense, & Krav Maga. Prior to joining law enforcement, Professor Hall served in the United States Army's 1st/75th Airborne Rangers, then later joined the 10th Special Forces Group.



Sensei Atsushi Ikemoto holds a Rokudan in Judo and a Godan in Jujitsu. He is a Life Member of Kilohana Martial Arts Association, Jujitsu America, and the U.S. Judo Association as well as a Martial Arts Hall of Fame Inductee. He is a graduate of the 1993 Okugi (Inner Secrets) Class as taught by Professor Sig Kufferath and Professor Tony Janovich as well as the Kilohana Okugi Class taught by Professor James Muro.

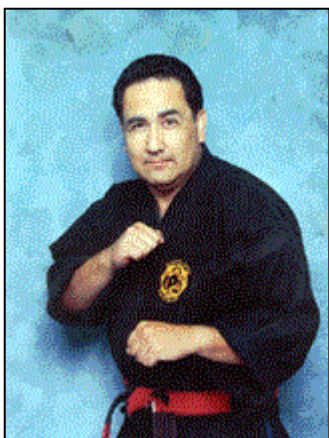
Sensei Ikemoto also holds numerous certificates in restorative therapy including Basic and Advanced Seifukujitsu as taught by Professor Sig Kufferath and Professor Tony Janovich, Accupressure as taught by Professor Jack Carter, and is an Instructor of Okazaki Restoration Therapy awarded by Professor Sig Kufferath and Professor James Muro.

His international studies include certificates in Qi Gong Therapy from the Medical Qi Gong Center in Beijing, China, Basic Thai Massage from Wat Po Traditional Medical School in Bangkok, Thailand, and Universal Life Energy Levels I-V as taught by Steven Tran.



Sensei Ingebretsen has been practicing martial art since 1974, and holds the rank of shichidan in kenpo karate (through the American Jujitsu Institute) and rokudan (sixth degree black belt) in Danzan Ryu Ju Jitsu (through Kilohana Martial Arts Association). He is ranked Hapa Lima Kekele'ele'ele (fifth degree black belt) in the Kaihewalu family lua system, and is a kumu lua (instructor) of the art. Hans also has the rank of godan (fifth degree black belt) in Ken Ju Ryu Kenpo Ju Jitsu, received from Shihan Russ Rhodes, founder of the Ken Ju Ryu System. Hans is recognized as rokudan in both the Pacific Jujitsu Alliance, and the Hawaii Martial Arts Society. He has received an instructor's certificate in Inayan Kadena de Mano Eskrima from Suro Jason Inay, the head of the Inayan System of eskrima, and also has a sandan (third degree black belt) in Kodokan Judo through the United States Judo

Association. In 1993 he was awarded a Renshi grade teaching license in Danzan Ryu by Professor Sig Kufferath, the Headmaster of the system, with whom he trained for 14 years. He is the president and one of the founders of Kilohana Martial Arts Association, and served for 11 years as vice president of Kilohana. Through his martial arts marketing business, Zanshin Enterprises, Hans promotes many seminars and tournaments. A former member of the San Jose State varsity judo squad, as well as other teams, he now coaches his own judo team, and is also active in promoting sport ju jitsu competitions. His own tournament, the Mokomoko Invitational, has been held annually since 2003, and includes competition in karate, ju jitsu and eskrima. Hans is a certified instructor in Danzan Ryu Ju Jitsu, Ken Ju Ryu Kenpo Ju Jitsu, Kodokan Judo, Kenpo Karate, Hawiian Lua and Inayan Kadena De Mano Eskrima.



Professor James Muro has been training and having fun with the martial arts since the age of five. He holds several ranks in the arts, including 8th dan in Hawaii's own Danzan Ryu Jujitsu, 8th dan in Kenpo Karate, 4th dan in Shorinji Ryu, 3rd dan in Judo. All received under the late great Professor John Chow-Hoon. He also received his master's certificate in Decuerdas Eskrima under grand master Gilbert Tenio and studied Serrada Eskrima from Professor Juan Eliab Sr. More recently he has been training in the Inayan System of Eskrima, specifically Inayan Kadena de Mano, under Suros Mike and Jason Inay. He is one of the founders of the Kilohana martial arts association, and acts as the technical director and chairman of the standards board committee.

He is a charter member of Jujitsu America and has been a member of it's standards board committee and has been awarded their "instructor of the year" (1981) and inducted to their "black belt hall of fame" (1984). He was the first to hold an organized "sport jujitsu" tournament in the U. S. And has been an official representative and international coach for the USA. in "sport jujitsu". He was inducted into the international "hall of fame" as a "grand master instructor" by the world head of family sokeship council (2001). He is also a technical advisor to the Scottish Kenpo association, and also the small circle jujitsu international organization (Prof Wally Jay founder). He is a senior advisor to the Hawaiian martial arts society. He also acts as a technical advisor and sits on the standards board committee for the world martial arts society based in europe. He was selected world martial arts society "instructor of the year" (2001). And is a regional representative for Lua O Kihewalu Halau. Also known as a healer, Professor Muro is a certified practioner and teacher of massage therapy and Seifukujitsu- Okazaki system. Professor Muro is known for his technical knowledge of the martial arts, he has combined all the various martial arts he has trained in to form a dramatic "island blend" or style of Ku'i Lima (fighting). He is a requested seminar instructor internationally but continues to be a "humble student."
